

Ocean County's Most Dangerous Roads

38 pedestrians were killed on Ocean County streets in the three years from 2006 through 2008. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that US-9, Route 549 and Route 528 suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.

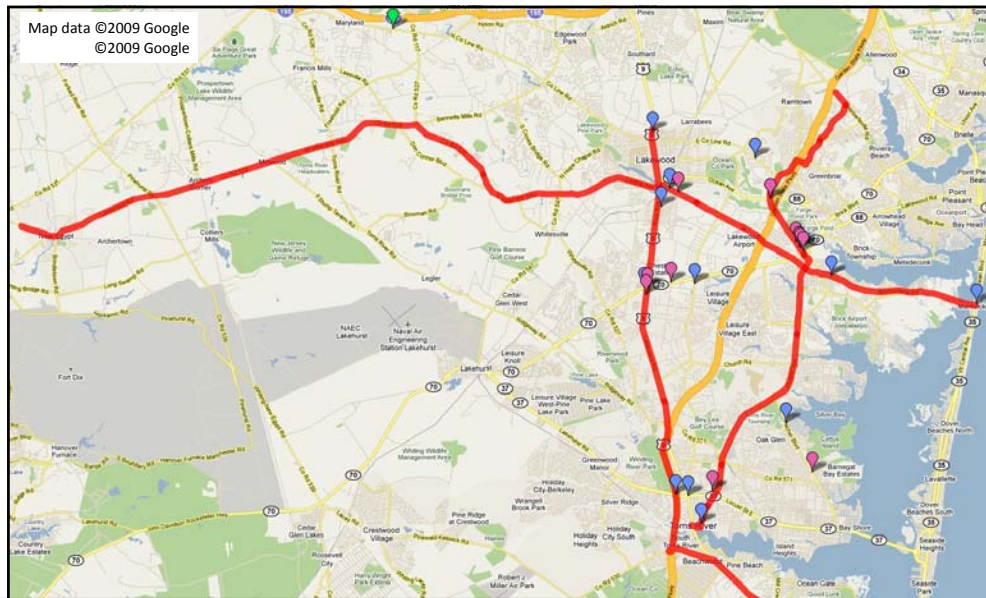

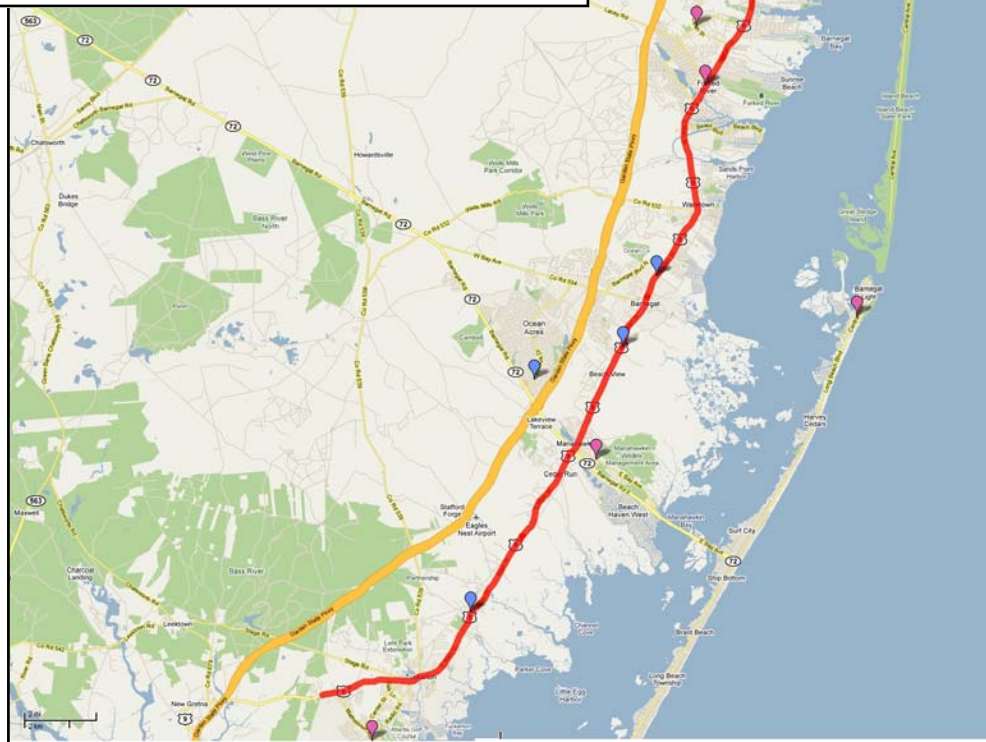
Location of Ocean County Pedestrian Fatalities
