

Suffolk County's Most Dangerous Roads

91 pedestrians were killed on Suffolk County streets in the three years from 2006 through 2008. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that Route 27, Route 25 and Route 27A suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.

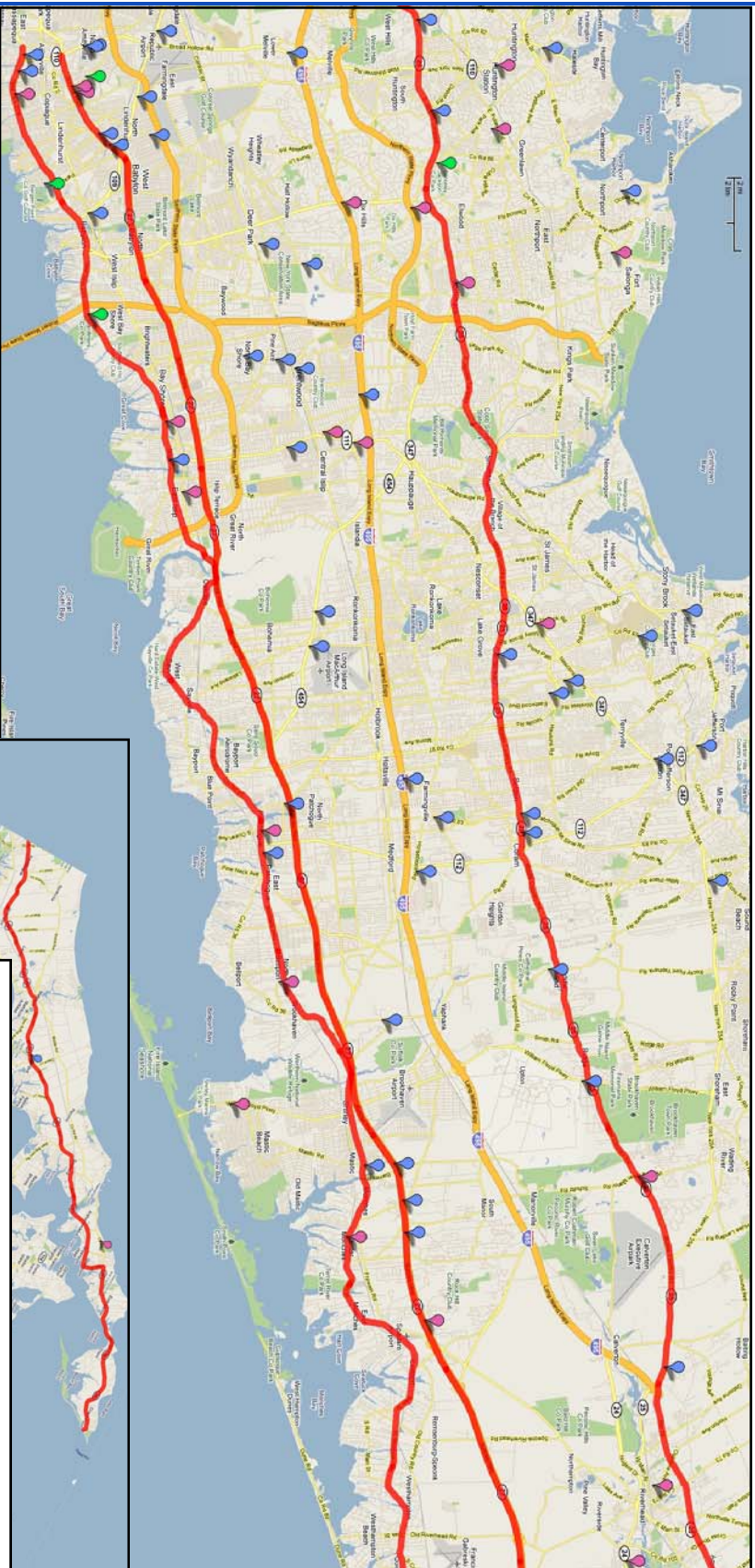
