

# Queens' Most Dangerous Roads

95 pedestrians were killed on Queens streets in the three years from 2005 through 2007. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveal that the Grand Central Parkway, Woodhaven Blvd, Cross Bay Blvd, Main St., Northern Blvd and Queens Blvd suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths
