

# Burlington County's Most Dangerous Roads for Bicyclists

From 2001 to 2010, 8,281 bicyclists were involved in accidents in eight Southern New Jersey counties (Atlantic, Burlington, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Gloucester, Ocean and Salem). During this period, there were 63 bicyclist fatalities.

Between 2001 and 2010, 831 bicyclists in Burlington County were in accidents. Fourteen bicyclists were killed in these crashes. Based on crash rate, Burlington County is the seventh most dangerous Southern New Jersey county for bicyclists.

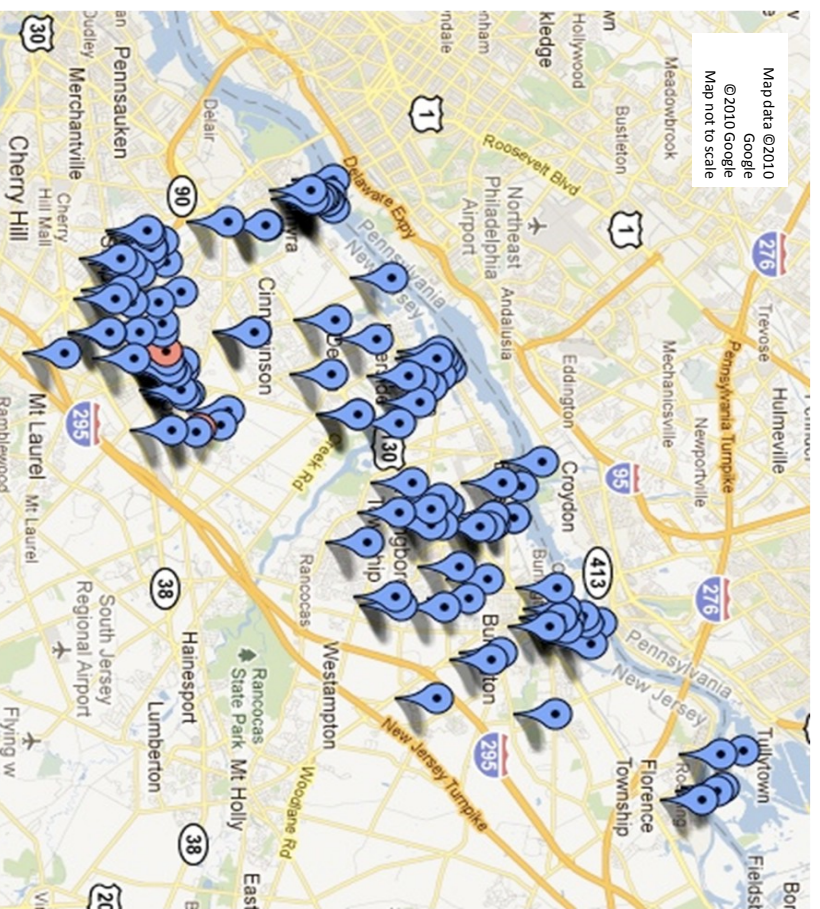
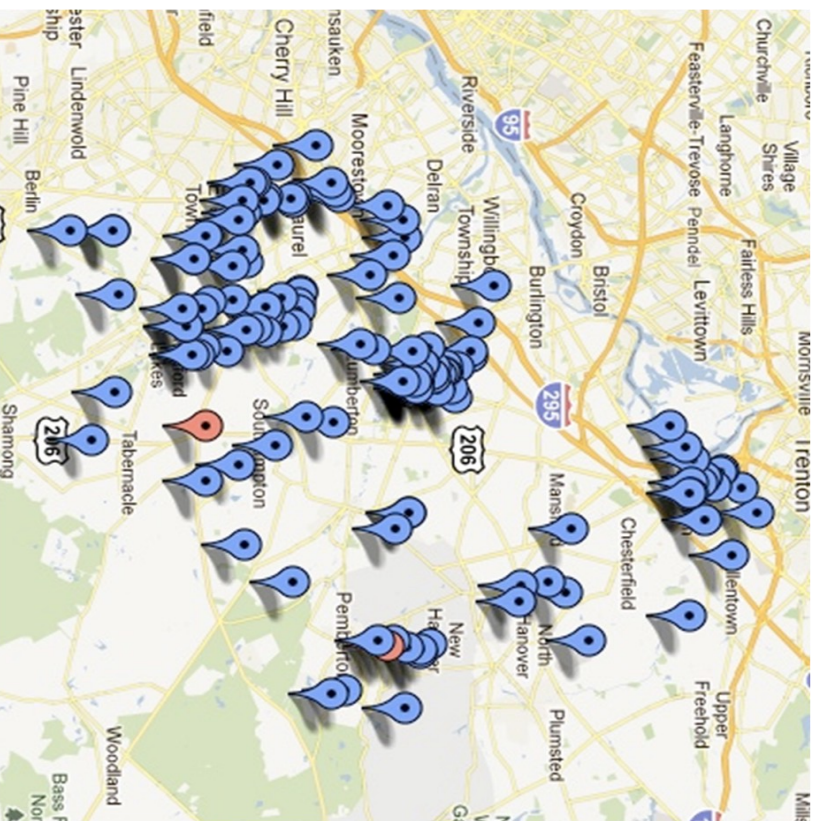
In Burlington County, 251 bicyclists were in accidents between 2008 and 2010. The Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of statewide crash records revealed that Route 537 (19 bicyclists in accidents), US 130 (15 bicyclists in accidents) and Burlington County 607 (13 bicyclists in accidents) were the three most dangerous roads for bicyclists in Burlington County during this period.
