

Salem County's Most Dangerous Roads for Bicyclists

From 2001 to 2010, 8,281 bicyclists were involved in accidents in eight Southern New Jersey counties (Atlantic, Burlington, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Gloucester, Ocean and Salem). During this period, there were 63 bicyclist fatalities.

Between 2001 and 2010, 162 bicyclists in Salem County were in accidents. One bicyclist was killed in these crashes. Based on crash rate, Salem County is the sixth most dangerous Southern New Jersey county for bicyclists.

In Salem County, 35 bicyclists were in accidents between 2008 and 2010. The Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of statewide crash records revealed that NJ 49 (5 bicyclists in accidents) and NJ 45 (3 bicyclists in accidents) were the two most dangerous roads for bicyclists in Salem County during this period.
