Manhattan's Most Dangerous Roads

101 pedestrians were killed on Manhattan streets in the three years from 2008 through 2010. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that Broadway, the Henry Hudson Pkwy (West St), Amsterdam Ave, 7th Ave, Bowery, 3rd Ave, and 14th St suffered the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period.


