

Atlantic County's Most Dangerous Roads

27 pedestrians were killed on Atlantic County roads in the three years from 2009 through 2011. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that US-322/40 and US-30 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.

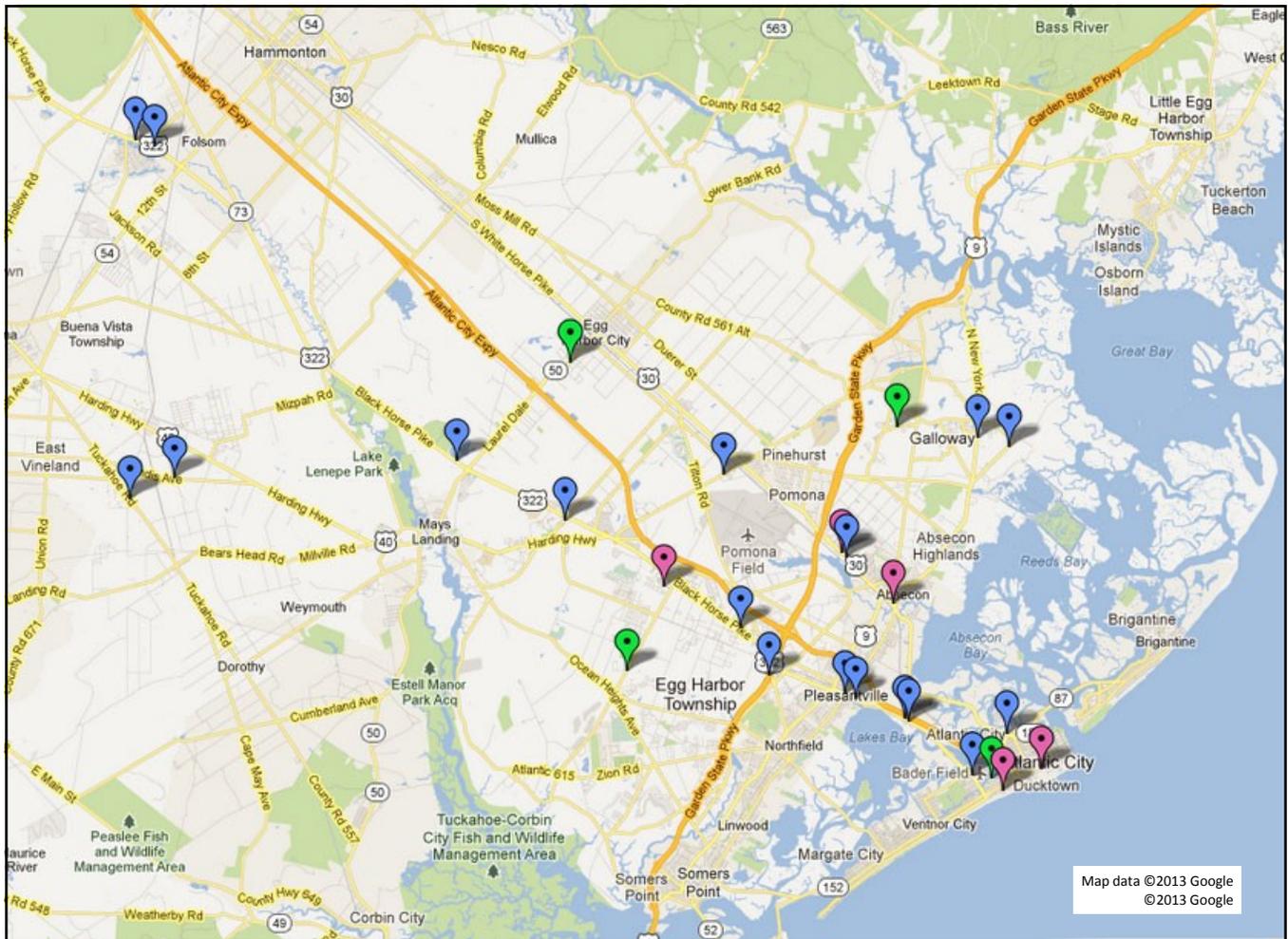
