

Burlington County's Most Dangerous Roads

17 pedestrians were killed on Burlington County roads in the three years from 2009 through 2011. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that US-130 (Burlington Pike) and Route 38 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.


