

Mercer County's Most Dangerous Roads

19 pedestrians were killed on Mercer County roads in the three years from 2009 through 2011. Tri-State Transportation Campaign's analysis of federal traffic fatality data reveals that US-206, Route 31, Route 653 and Route 129 had the highest number of pedestrian deaths over the period studied.


